God's So Great Salvation - Discussion Guide

Gain a deeper understanding of the ideas presented in the Paris Reidhead books "Finding the Reality of God" and "Evidences of Eternal Life," and sermon series, So Great Salvation, by using these discussion guide questions.

Before the beginning

- What was the purpose of the Apostle John in writing this epistle (1 John)?
- Who is Satan? Why was he cast out of heaven?
- God is light, love, truth and life. What did Satan become as a result of his rebellion against the Most High?

In the beginning

- What is the difference between temptation and sin?
- Adam and Eve were commanded not to eat of the tree of knowledge of good and evil. Why?
- What outward change did disobedience bring into the lives of Adam & Eve?
- Why was Abel's offering acceptable to God?
- Why was Cain's offering unacceptable?

SCRIPTURES: Matthew 5:27-28, 1 John 2:16, Genesis 3:12, Hebrews 9:22

Conversion

- In your own words, define what it means to repent
- Why is it essential for conversion?
- What part does our human will play in repentance?
- Is repentance a one-time act, or is it something we do continually? Explain
- What does it mean to eat Christ's flesh and drink His blood? Does the explanation given in this chapter differ with your previous understanding of this command?
- Has the Lord given you an awareness of any areas of your life inner attitudes or outward actions that are not pleasing to Him?
- What is your understanding about Jesus' exhortation, "Take up your cross daily and follow me?"

Awakening

- What is "easy believism," and what has caused its growth?

- What does it mean to intercede on behalf of sinners? Who is given this responsibility?
- What does it mean to be a witness?
- What does it mean to "believe on the Lord Jesus Christ?"

- How does Horatius Bonar describe "the witness of the Spirit?"
- What reason does the Bible give for our redemption?
- What gives man true understanding?

R.A. Torrey wrote, "To abide in Christ is to renounce any independent life of our own, to give up trying to think our thoughts, or form our resolutions or cultivate our feelings and simply and constantly look to Christ to think His thoughts in us, to form His purposes in us, to feel his emotions and affections in us. It is to

renounce all life independent of Christ, and constantly to look to Him for the inflow of His life into us, and the outworking of His life through us."

- The world thinks in instant terms. Is salvation instantaneous? Explain your answer.
- Is overcoming instantaneous? Explain your answer.
